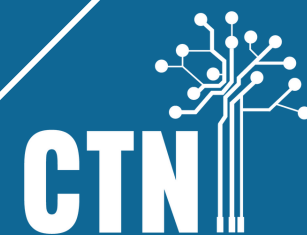

## Types of Computers



**Laptop-** Small, portable computer with keyboard and touchpad



**Tablet-** Small, portable computer with touchscreen



**Smartphone-** A cell phone with a built-in computer



**Desktop-** Non-portable computer designed for office or home work, with separate keyboard and mouse



**Hardware-** Parts of PC you can touch (screen, power button, mouse)



**Software-** Set of instructions / programs that tell hardware what to do (web browser, app)



**App-** Application. A small, specialized software program that you download on mobile device (Skype, Facebook)



**Download-** To transfer something from one place to another (internet to device)

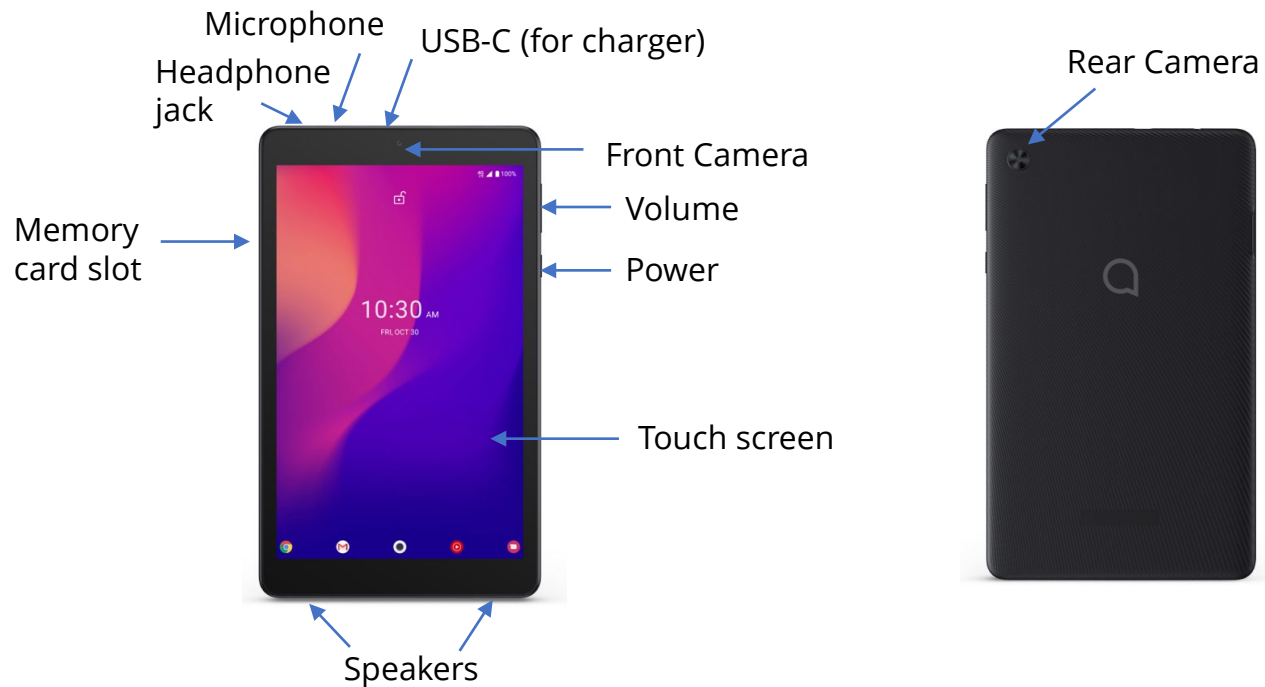


**Wi-Fi-** Wireless connection to the internet

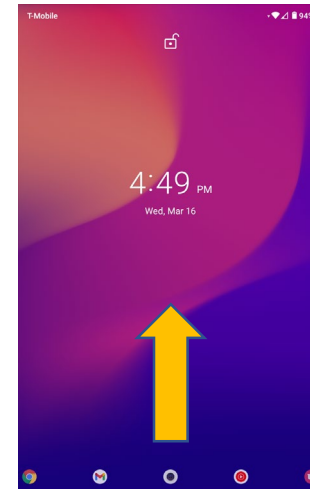


## Getting to Know Your Device

### Turn on your tablet

Find the power button, **press and hold** it for 1-2 seconds until it vibrates. The Alcatel and T-Mobile logos will appear on the screen.

**Swipe up** from the bottom of the lock screen to unlock your tablet.

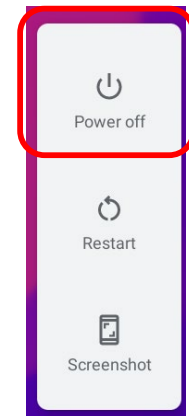


### Turn off your tablet

Find the power button, **press and hold** it for 1-2 seconds until it vibrates and you see Power off and Restart on the screen.

Quickly tap **Power off**. (If you hold Power off, the tablet will reboot in safe mode).

- **Note:** If you are inactive for 10 minutes or you press the power button when the tablet is on, it will enter **SLEEP mode** (the screen turns black). Press the power button again to wake it up.
- On the **lock screen**, the tablet goes to sleep more quickly
- Your tablet's **battery** will drain more quickly in sleep mode than when turned off.

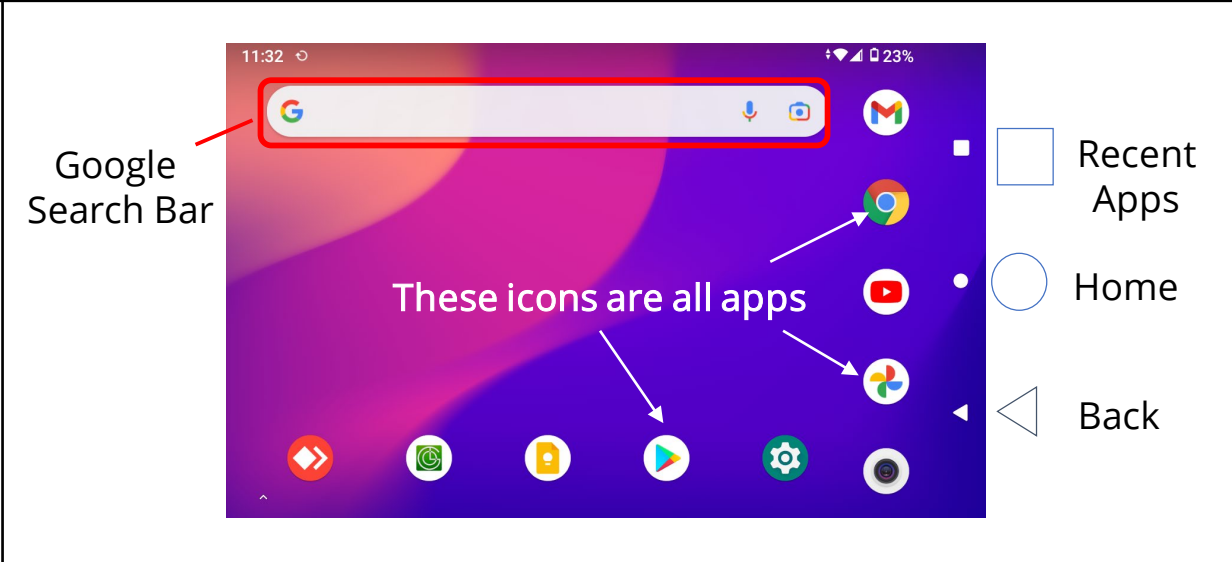


## Getting to Know Your Device

**Home Screen**


On this screen, you can tap on icons to open apps or do a Google search using the search bar at the top.

To see all the apps installed on the tablet, **swipe up** from the bottom of the screen.




**Status indicators (Top of the screen)**

You can easily check your battery charge, the time, and your Wi-Fi connection.



Current Time

Fully white = you're connected and the signal is strong



WLAN Remaining (WiFi) Battery

Empty/partially filled = you're not connected or connection is weak

## Getting to Know Your Device

**Notifications & tiles**

In the top left of your screen, you may see some icons next to the time. These represent your notifications.

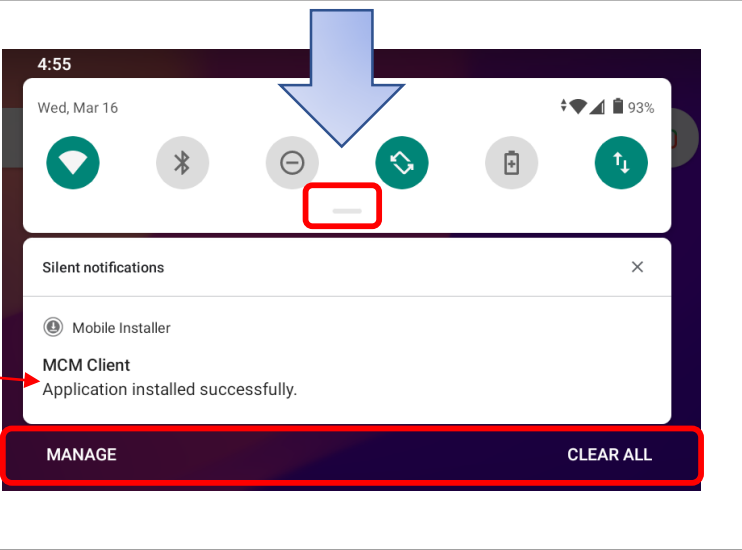
**Swipe down** from the top of the screen to view.

Pull down on the gray bar to see more tiles (green- turned on; gray- turned off)

Tap on a notification to go to that app

Tap to manage notifications or clear notifications



**Closing apps**

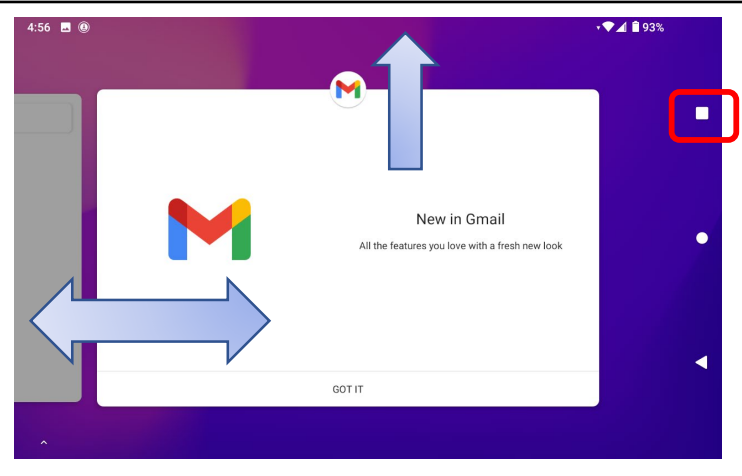
The home button will take you out of an app but to **close it**, tap the **Recent apps** button.

Leaving too many apps open can make your tablet slow.

Swipe your finger to the right to see all the open apps

Tap anywhere on a window to go to it

**Swipe up** on an app to close it

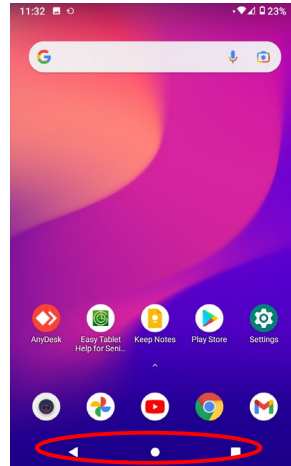


## Getting to Know Your Device

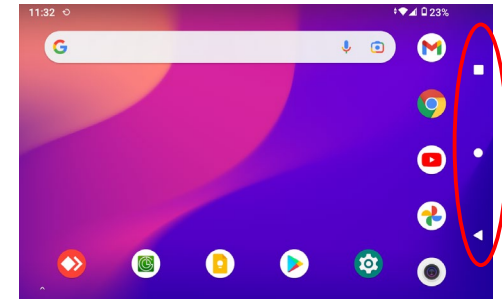
### Screen rotation

You can use your tablet in a vertical or horizontal orientation. Pick it up and try turning it. The screen will automatically rotate based on how you're holding it.

(If the tablet is lying on a surface, it won't work)



\*Notice that the navigation buttons may be on the bottom or the right side of your screen



### Gestures (Illustrations designed by macrovector / Freepik)



**Tap** to open apps or click on something



**Swipe** your finger(s) left or right to move between pages



**Scroll** to move up or down on a page



**Spread 2-3 fingers** to zoom in



**Pinch 2-3 fingers** to zoom out



**Hold & Drag** Touch and hold an app, move it to the desired place and release

## Wi-Fi and Font Size Settings

### Connecting to Wi-Fi

You'll need to use Wi-Fi for most functions on your tablet.

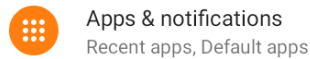
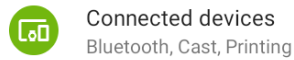
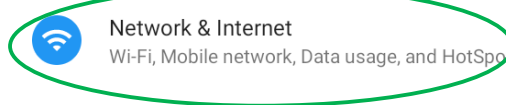
Before getting started, you'll need to know:

- the name of your Wi-Fi
- the password

After connecting the first time, your tablet will remove the wi-fi network and connect to automatically.

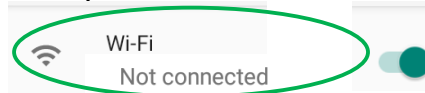

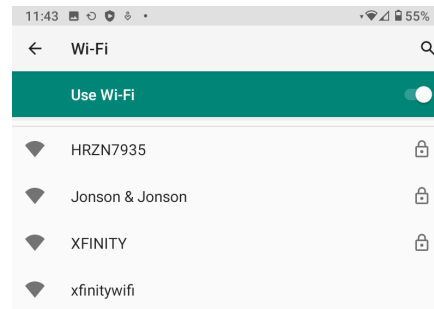

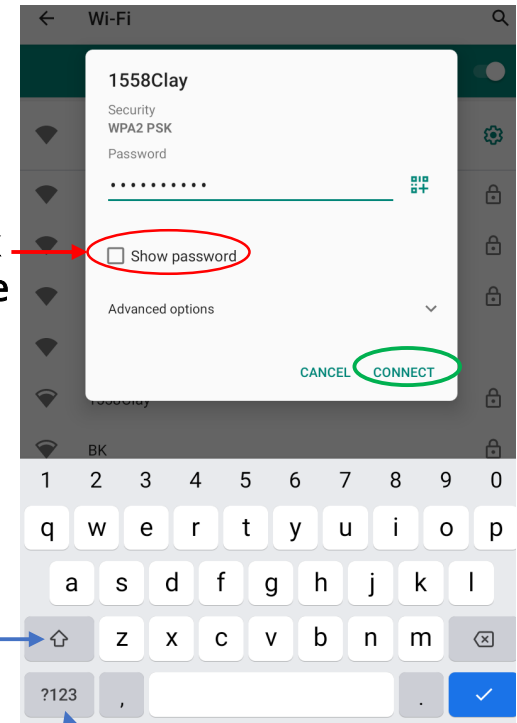

## Display & Font Settings

### Font & display size

If you're struggling to see what's on the tablet, you can increase the font size and display size.

There are many other settings you can explore and play around with to customize the look of the tablet and how it works.

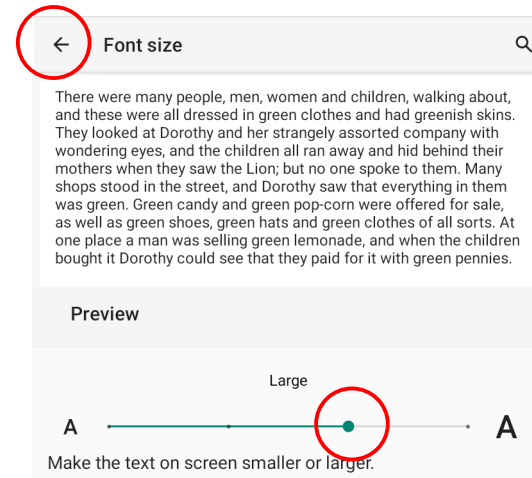

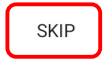

Android tablets require you sign in to a **Google account** for full access to the apps and services available.

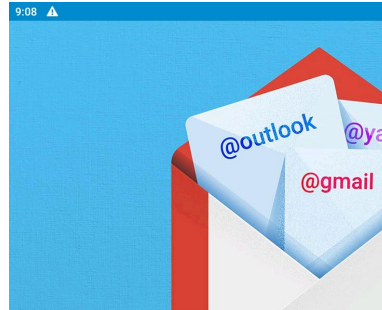

If you already have an email address, you'll need to know the exact address and password.

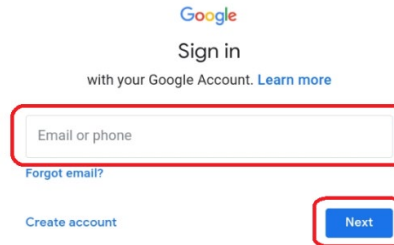

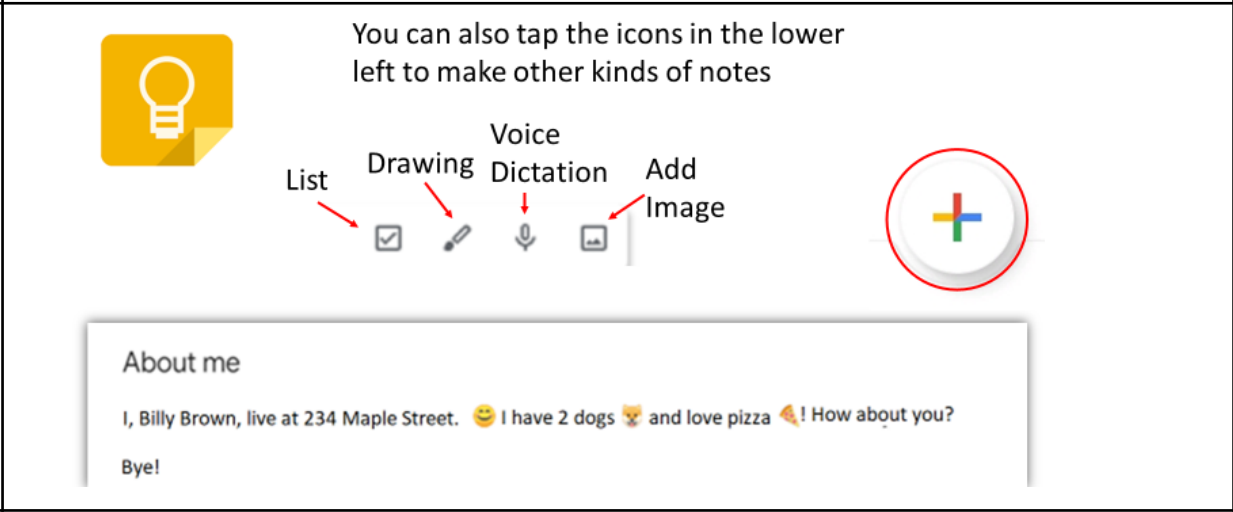
Whenever you need to type something, a keyboard will appear on the bottom of your screen. Let's take a look at all the buttons.

Your **keyboard** will appear. See if you can copy this text exactly.

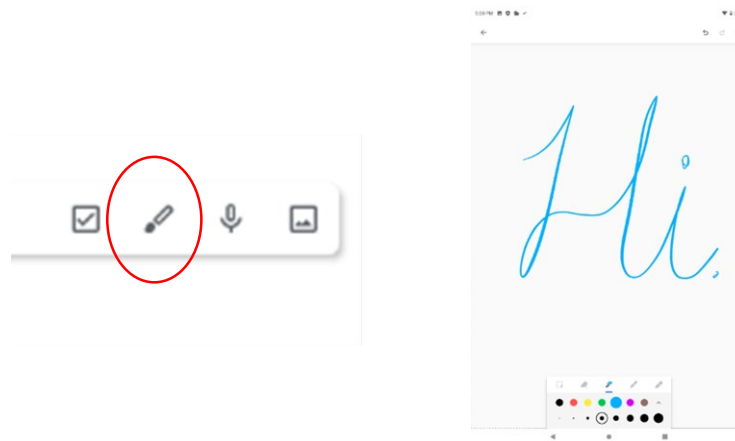


## Optional Topics

In Keep Notes, tap on the paintbrush.

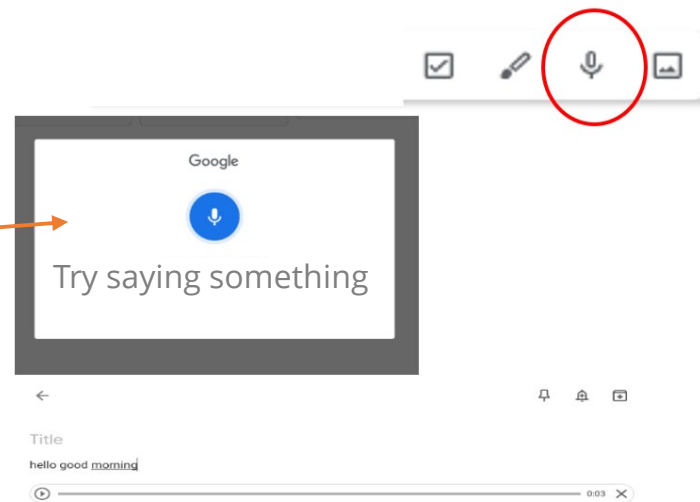
You can change the color and / or size. Practice writing "Hi" or drawing a simple picture. Try using multiple colors and sizes.

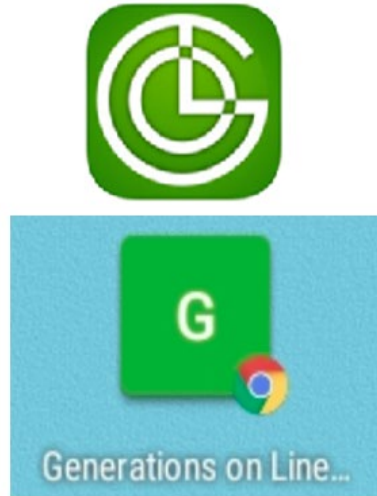
In Keep Notes, tap on the microphone. When you see this, say a short message.

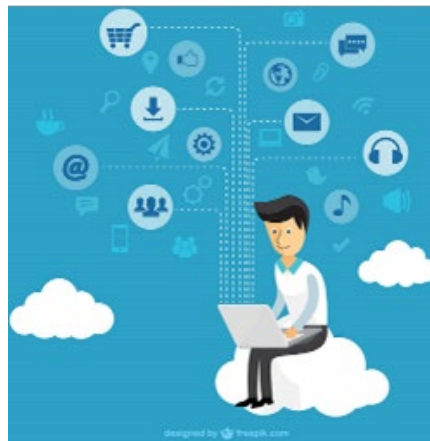

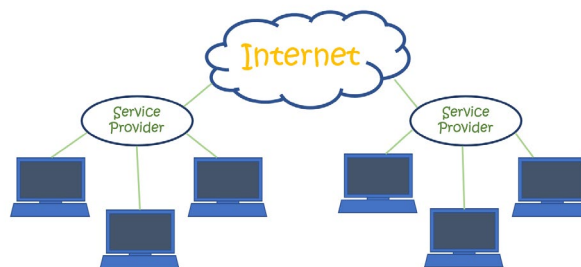

The Internet is a **global network** of billions of computers and other electronic devices, connected by **physical cables** to **servers**, which store websites. We access the Internet with the help of **Internet Service Providers (ISPs)**, such as Comcast, AT&T, Cable One, etc.

The **World Wide Web (www)** is the vast collection of info that can be accessed on the Internet.

When you connect your device to the Internet (go online), you can access a huge amount of information, communicate with people around the world, and much more.



Practice using the search bar

Tap on the Search bar to begin your search. Notice the blinking line. Once your keyboard pops up, proceed to type in what you'd like to search.

Below the search bar you'll see recommended or recent searches





<p><b>Enter your search</b></p> <p>Once typed, select the “Enter” or “Search” button to begin searching the Internet.</p>	 <p>The button to search could look like any of these</p>
<p><b>Practice searching for something with your voice</b></p> <p>Tap on the search bar to begin. Tap the microphone on the right side of the search bar. Once tapped, it will say “LISTENING” which means it is recording whatever you say and will begin the search as soon as you finish.</p>	 <p>Microphone button</p> <p><b>*Remember to have your volume set to a comfortable level!</b></p>
<p>Try to limit what you want to search to <b>KEY WORDS</b> instead of full sentences.</p> <p>Doing so will ensure more accurate results!</p>	

## Adding Icon on Home Screen for your Favorite Websites (1/2)

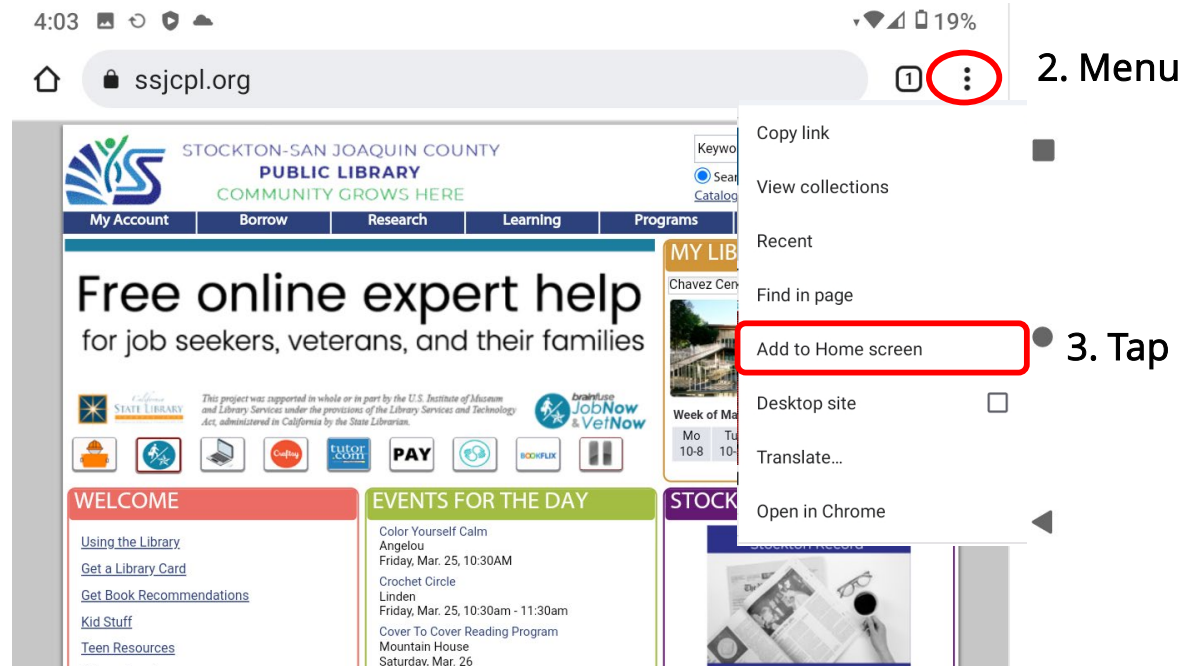
Many people have certain websites that they frequently visit. Instead of opening your browser or using the search bar to visit these websites we can make the process shorter by adding an icon to the Home Screen.

**Practice adding icon on your Home Screen, for frequently visited websites**

1. Tap on the search bar and visit the website of your choosing

2. Once on your website, tap the three circles (Menu button) on the upper right-hand corner of the search bar

3. Scroll down and tap Add to Home Screen



## Adding Icon on Home Screen for your Favorite Websites (2/2)

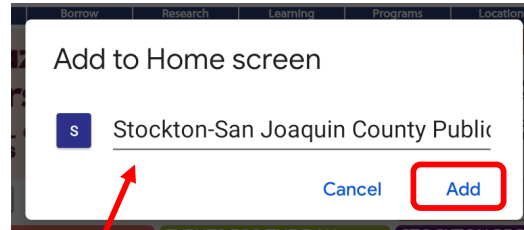
4. Once you click “Add to Home Screen” you’ll be prompted to enter a name for the icon.

This could be a nickname or shortcut instead of putting the full website address.

5. Tap **Add** after entering the name.

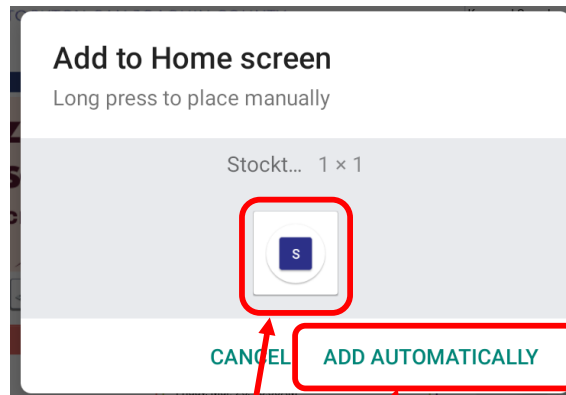
6. Tap **Add automatically** OR tap and hold on the icon and start to drag it. The home screen will appear and you can drop the icon where you want it.

Chrome for Android loads the website as a “web app” when you tap the icon.

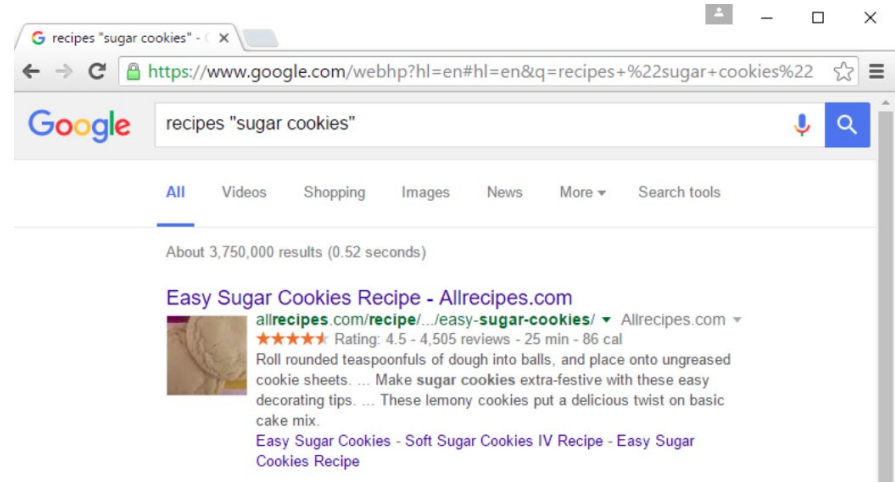
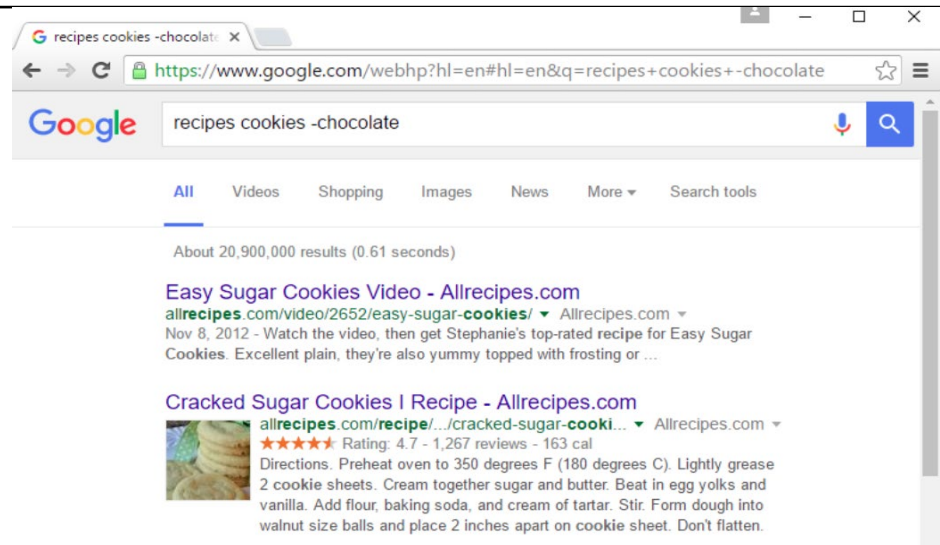
## (Optional) Refining your search



You can use some special characters to help refine your search such as the minus sign.

For example, you want to find cookie recipes that don't include chocolate, you could search for **cookie recipes -chocolate**.

You can also search for exact words or phrases to narrow down your results even more. All you need to do is place quotation marks ( " ") around the desired search terms. For example, if you search for recipes "sugar cookies", your search results will only include recipes for sugar cookies, instead of any cookies that happen to use sugar as an ingredient.

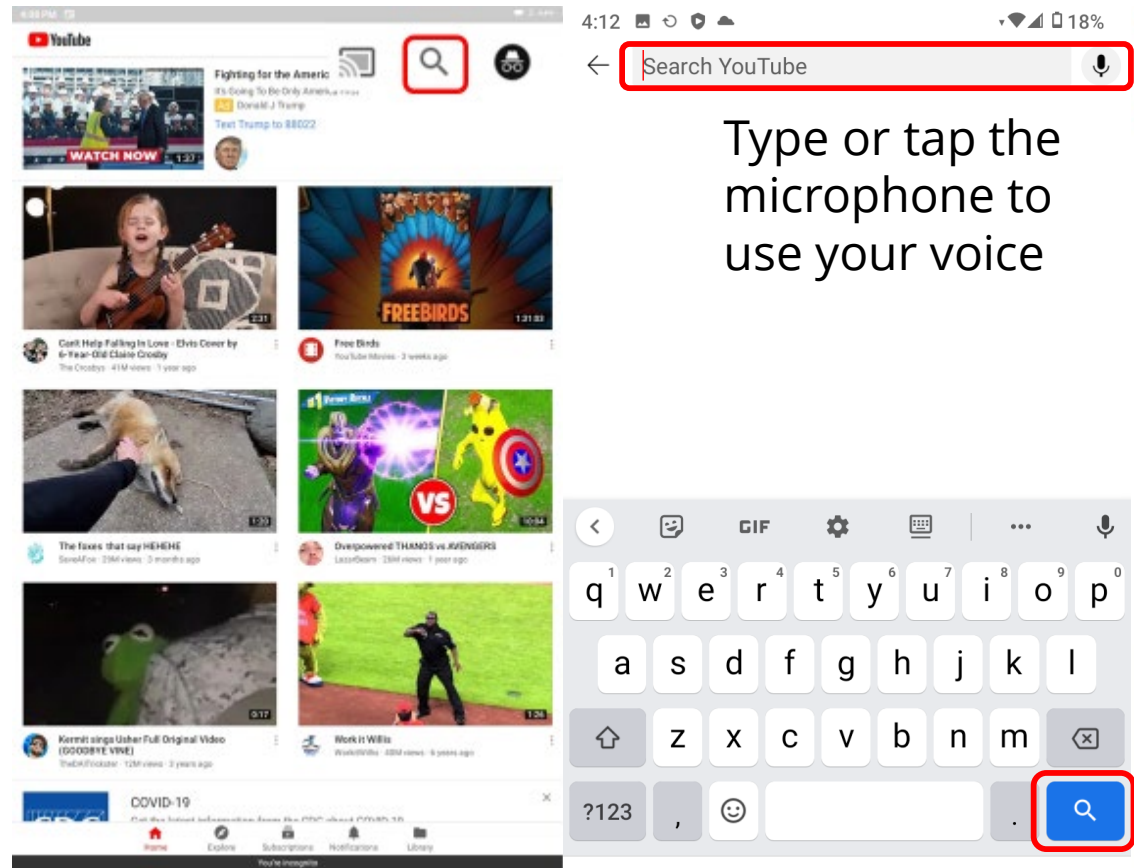

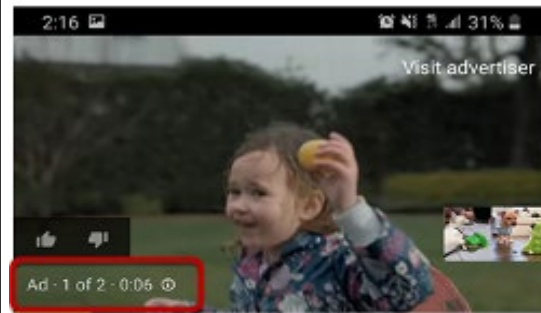
## Skipping ads on YouTube videos

The "Skip ads" button is located on the lower right-hand side of the video.



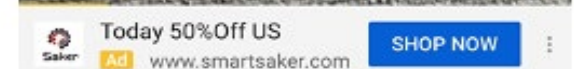

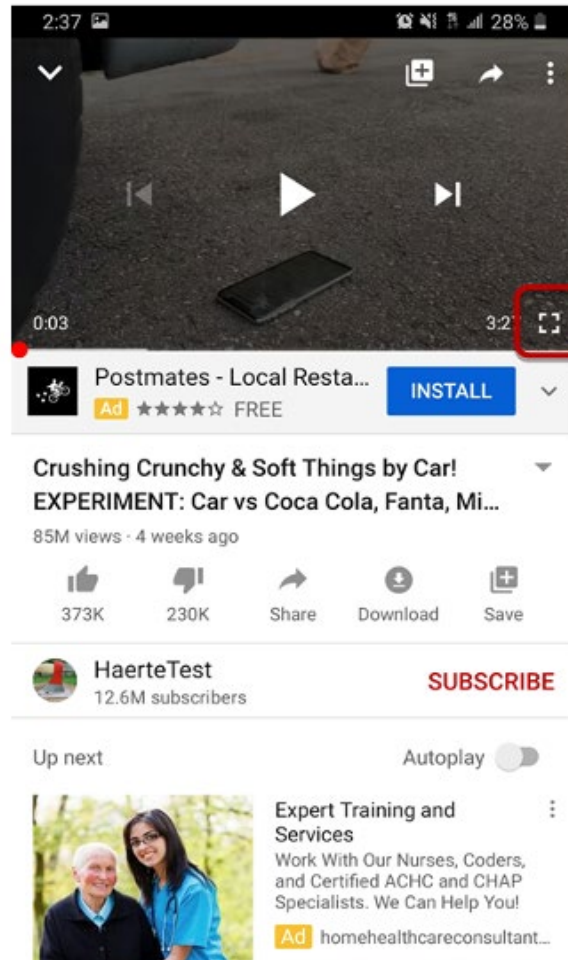
## Watching your video in full screen

Once you've selected your video and skipped the ads, you can choose how you want to watch the video

There are 2 options:

1. Leave the video small and have access to the comments and other recommended videos
2. Watch your video in full screen

To watch in full screen, click the **Full Screen** button

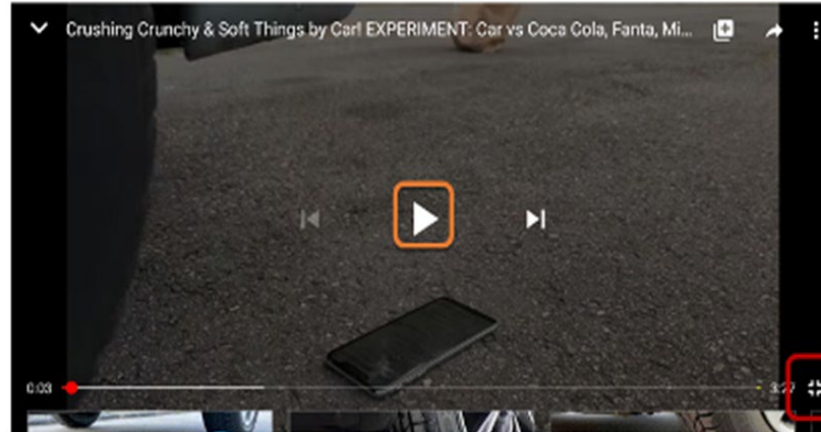


Tap for Full-Screen



### Turning off full screen

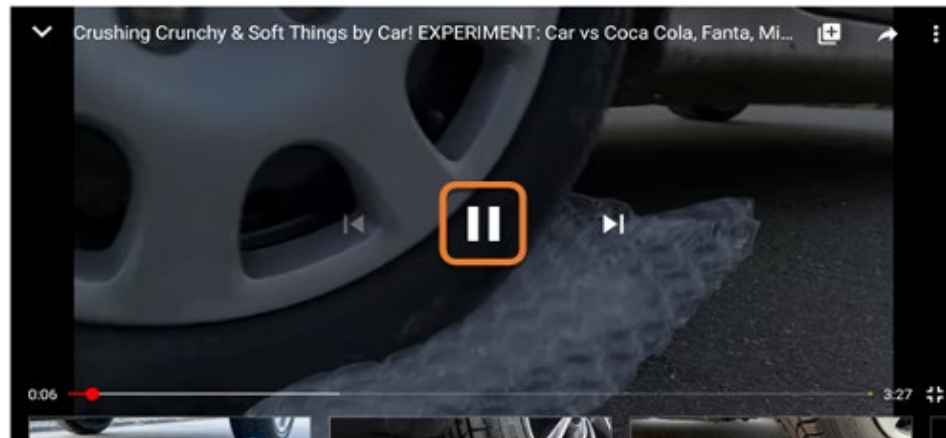
Once you're finished watching a video in full screen you can simply click the same button to shrink the video back into its original format



Tap the "shrink" button to return video to original format

### Pausing videos

To pause your video, simply tap on the screen and buttons will appear. Press the **Pause** button to stop your video. Once you're ready to resume, click the **Play** button



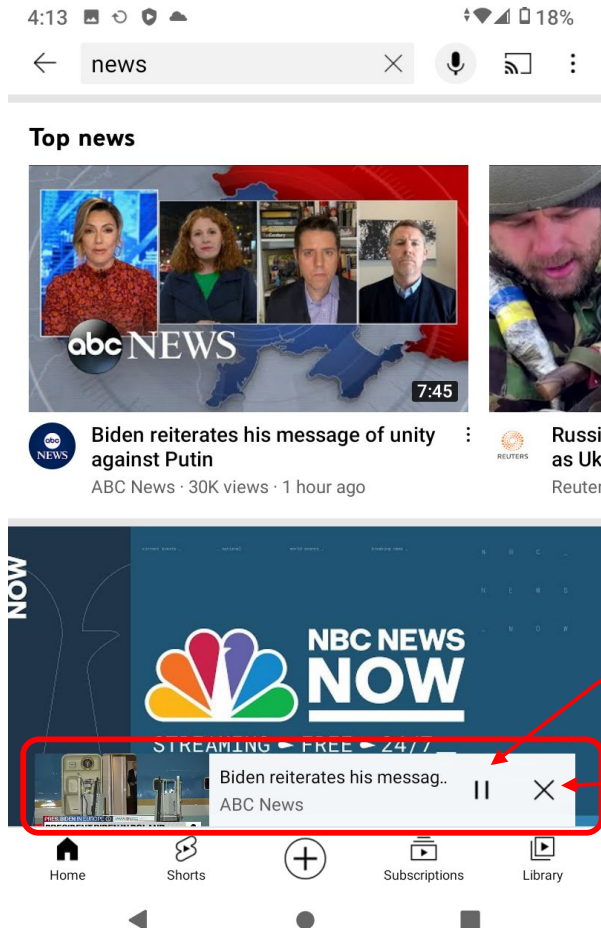
## Closing videos

To close your video and return back to your search, click on the **Back** button.

This will return you to your search result list. Notice the video is minimized at the bottom and continues to play

Tap the small **X** button to close the video.

You can also pause the video and return to it later by tapping it.



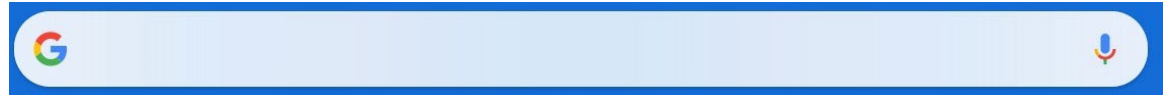

## Introduction to Email

### What is email?

Email, or electronic mail, allows you to send messages from your computer to a recipient(s) via the Internet. Emails can include text, files, images, or other attachments. It's a quick, easy and free way to communicate!



To use it, you must have an **email address** with an **email service**.

### Email address

Each email address is unique and consists of 3 main parts:

- Username
- @ ("at")
- Domain name

## Using Gmail

### Gmail



Let's open Gmail. Find the app on your home screen and tap.

When you open the app, you should already be logged in to the account you created/ logged into in Lesson 1.

**Menu**  
Check out your different folders.

**Inbox**  
Scroll down to see more emails.

**Search mail**  
Search for emails with certain words or from certain people

**Email**  
Here you'll see your most recent email/email thread. Tap on another email in your inbox to open it here.

**Compose button**  
Press this button to write an email.

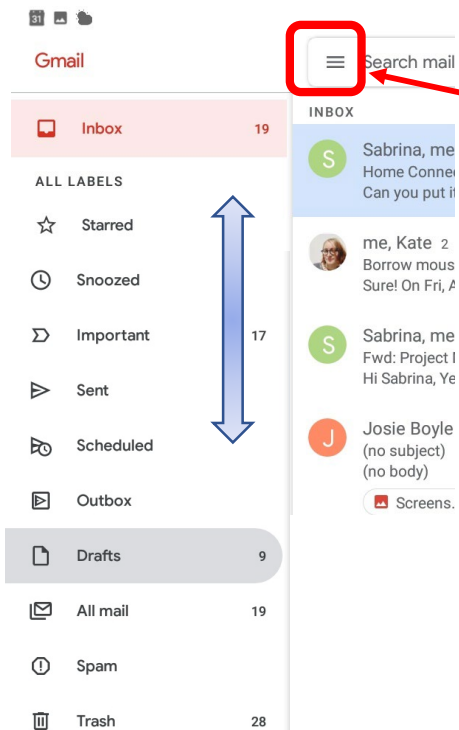
If you're looking at an **email thread** (a group of related emails comprised of replies/forwards), you can tap within the thread on specific emails to open them.

## Gmail menu

All your emails are marked with labels.

If you're expecting an email and it never arrives in your inbox, check your Spam folder.

If you start composing an email but don't send it, it will save automatically in your **Drafts** folder.




Tap on the menu button to see your options. To look at the emails in a category, just tap.

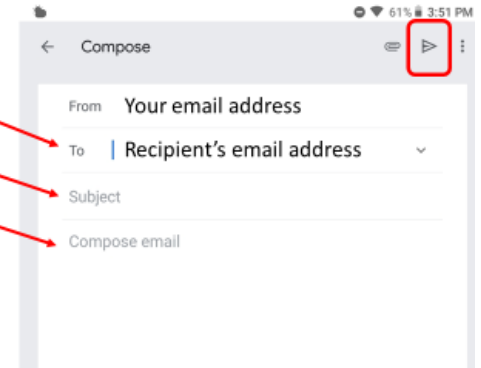
You can use these labels to help **organize** your mail and more easily **find** what you need.

Scroll down further for **Settings**.

## Compose an email

Emails are a more formal type of communication than texting and social media. Unless it's a casual email to a friend/family member, use complete sentences, capitalization, punctuation, and proper spelling and grammar.

1. Tap the  button on the bottom of your screen.
2. Type the email address of your recipient(s).
3. Tap **Subject** to type a short, concise subject.
4. Tap **Compose email** and type your message.
5. When you're finished, tap the Send button on the top (paper airplane)

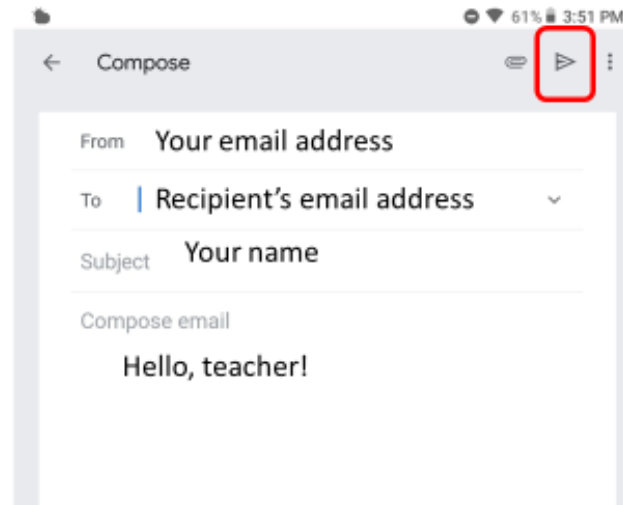

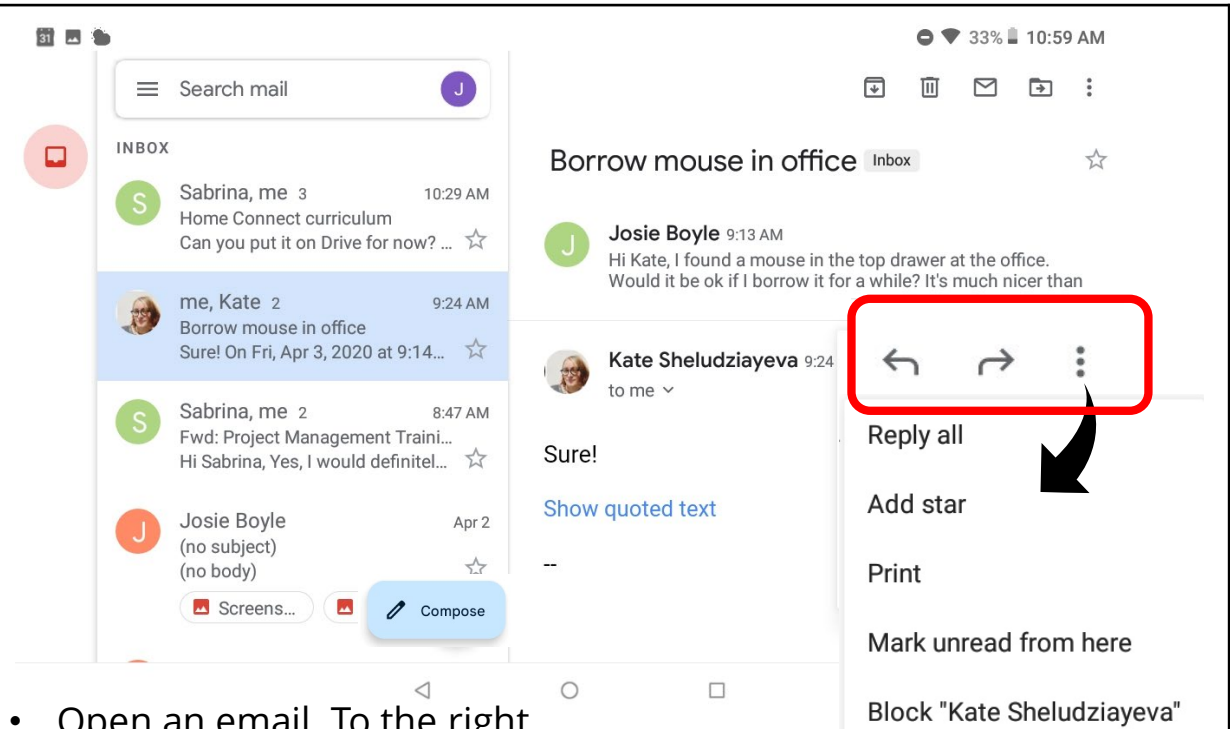
## Replying to an email ↩

If you receive an email from someone and want to respond, you don't need to compose a new email. Just reply directly.

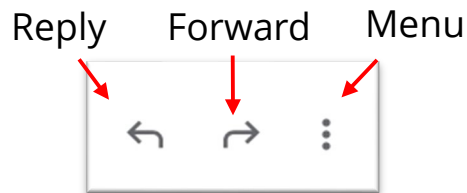
If the email was sent to multiple people, keep in mind whether you want to reply just to the sender, or to everyone. If you want everyone in the email thread to receive your message, tap the menu, then select **Reply all**.

## Forwarding an email ↗

To send an email you received to someone else, click the Forward button and enter the email address of your recipient(s).



- Open an email. To the right of the sender's name you have a few options.



\*If you received an email from a company, it often says not to reply to the message. To contact them, do a Google search to find their contact information.



## (Beyond the Basics) What else can you do with an email?

**Archive** removes an email from your inbox. You can still access it by looking in the “All Mail” folder.

**Delete** moves an email to your Trash folder. It will be deleted permanently after 30 days.

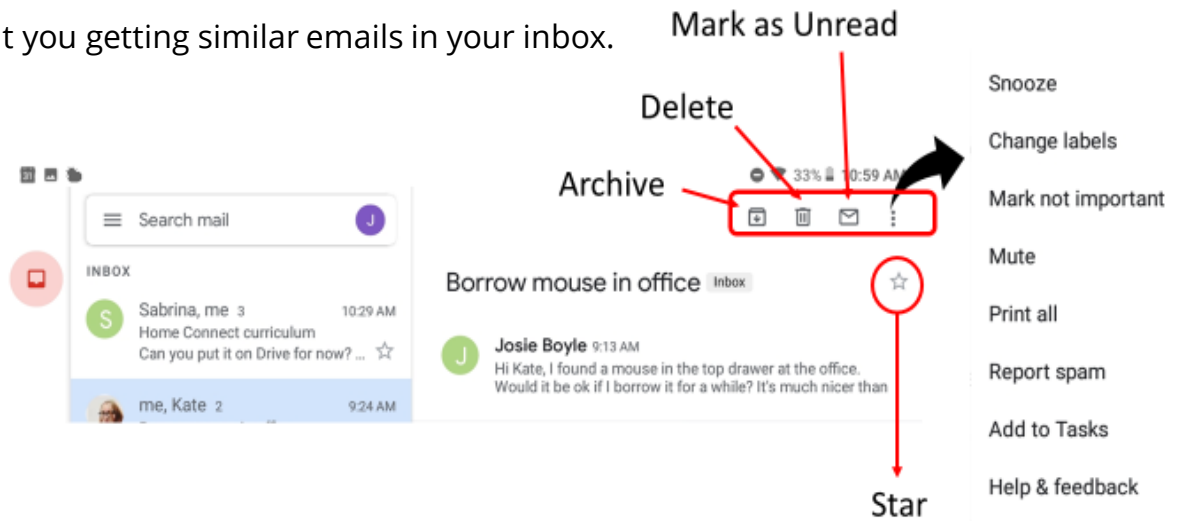
**Mark as Unread** will make an email bold in your inbox, as though you haven’t opened it yet.

**Star** important emails to find easily. They’ll be stored in your Starred folder.

**Snooze** an email to temporarily remove it from your inbox until later (you set when it will reappear).

**Mute** an email thread—the conversation, including all future replies, will be found in “All Mail” but won’t show up in your inbox.

**Report spam** will let Gmail know that a spam email made it to your inbox. This will help strengthen Gmail’s spam filter and prevent you getting similar emails in your inbox.

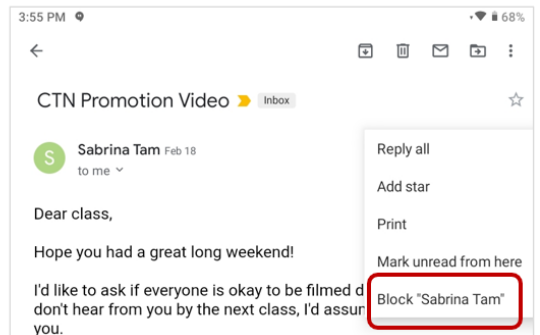
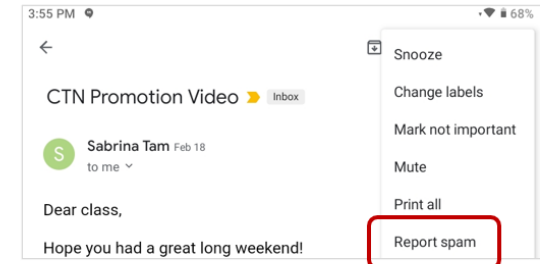
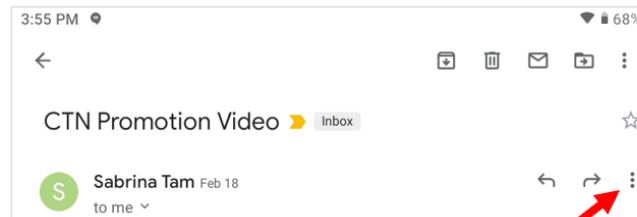
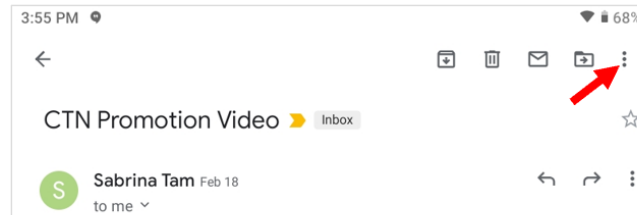


## Email Safety

**Spam:** Junk mail; unsolicited advertising.

What do you do if you believe you have received a spam email?

- Just delete the email, and/or
- Report the email as **Spam** or **Block** the sender


### Phishing:

Certain emails pretend to be from a bank or trusted source in order to steal your personal information.

### Red Flags:

- Unfamiliar email address
- Errors in email address
- Sense of urgency
- Bogus/mismatched URL links
- Requests for login info
- Spelling/grammar errors
- Generic greeting
- Lack of details
- Links to insecure websites
- Attached document

Callouts on the right side of the screenshot provide the following explanations:

- FROM:** ALWAYS check the 'from' email address, and be aware that even this can be spoofed.
- Sender:** Scammers will make every attempt to make the email look legit. If in doubt, check with the organisation directly.
- Body Text:** May contain spelling mistakes and poor grammar.
- Warning:** Scammers may feign a sense of urgency or make threats to trick you in to action.
- Call to Action:** ALWAYS check links in emails are real before clicking on them. Hover on desktops or 'tap and hold' on mobile devices.
- Attachment:** NEVER open or download anything unless you are 100% sure they are from a safe source, especially if they are an .EXE file.

## Phishing

If you receive an email from your bank or another institution asking you to log in, change your password, enter your card info, etc., always call to confirm or visit the website to log in to your account- NOT through the link but through your browser.



Scammers can create look-alike websites and links in order to steal your info.

**Tips:** Don't click on links in email or on social media from banks, credit card companies, government agencies, or other organizations, unless you're 100% certain they are legitimate.

Avoid clicking on links or downloading attachments in unsolicited email, as there is a chance they could link to sites designed to scam people or infect computers with malicious software.

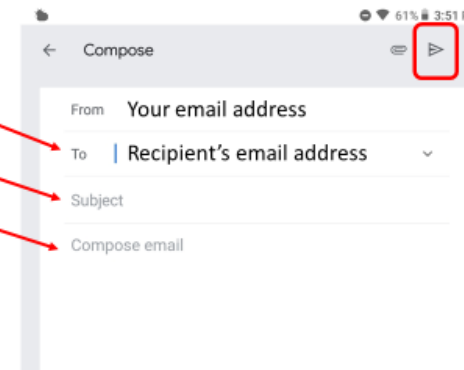

## QUESTION 1

### Bothered by Bogus Banking Banter?

You receive an email from your bank informing you that it suspects an unauthorized transaction on your account. To protect your account, the email advises you to click on a link to verify your identity. Should you do so?

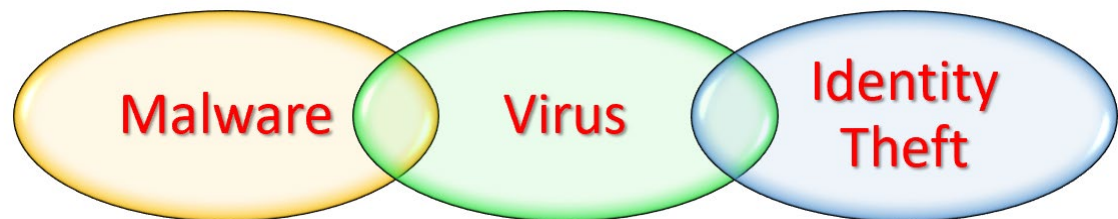

- drain your bank account
- run up charges on your credit cards
- open new utility accounts
- get medical treatment on your health insurance
- file a tax refund in your name and get your refund, etc.

## Malware and Virus

**What is malware?**

Any piece of software that was written with the intent of performing malicious deeds



Software consists of code developed by cyber-attackers with the purpose of causing damage to data, a system, or to gain access to a network

**How could a virus or malware infect your device?**

- Downloading from websites that have either deliberately or accidentally been infected by one or more viruses
- Downloading apps which are infected
- Connecting your device to a computer that is infected, for example in order to sync, and load music

**Ways to avoid viruses and malware:**


- Only download apps that you trust
- Only download from websites that you trust
- Do some research online before downloading, check their ratings/scores
- Do not download apps or things from websites on public Wi-Fi
- **Always think before downloading!**



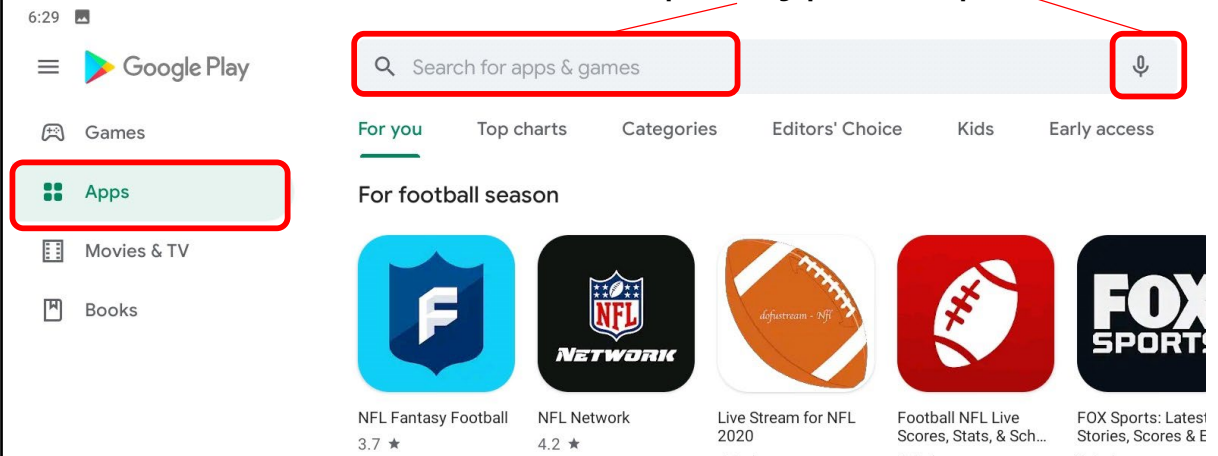

Two kinds of fake news:  
**Stories that aren't true** - Deliberately invented stories designed to make people believe something false, to buy a certain product, or to visit a certain website (clickbaits)

**Stories that have some truth, but aren't 100 percent accurate** - Fake news that is biased, and aims to convince readers of a certain political or ideological viewpoint.

### Where Does Fake News Come From?

- Fake news is nothing new.
- The Internet and social media platforms make it much easier for almost anyone to publish their thoughts or share stories with the world.

- If a company responsible for exposing your information offers you free credit monitoring, take advantage of it.
- Get your free credit reports from [annualcreditreport.com](https://annualcreditreport.com). Check for any accounts or charges you don't recognize.
- Consider placing a [credit freeze](#). A credit freeze makes it harder for someone to open a new account in your name.
  - If you place a freeze, be ready to take a few extra steps the next time you apply for a new credit card or cell phone – or any service that requires a credit check.
  - If you decide not to place a credit freeze, at least consider [placing a fraud alert](#).
- Try to file your taxes early — before a scammer can. Tax identity theft happens when someone uses your Social Security number to get a tax refund or a job. Respond right away to letters from the IRS.
- Don't believe anyone who **calls** and says you'll be arrested unless you pay for taxes or debt — even if they have part or all of your Social Security number, or they say they're from the IRS.
- Continue to check your credit reports at [annualcreditreport.com](https://annualcreditreport.com). You can order a free report from each of the three credit reporting companies once a year.

# AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

## WHAT IS IT?

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

### The benefit provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for internet service;
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider.

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

**A household is eligible if one member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:**

- Has an income that is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guide lines;
- Participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline;
- Participates in Tribal specific programs, such as Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations;
- Is approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school break fast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income program.

Go to [ACPBenefit.org](https://www.acpbenefit.org) to submit an application or print out a mail-in application.

# 2

Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete.

Eligible households must both apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.
